

WATERVILLE POST OFFICE

Corner of Main & Elm Streets ~ Map #1



This was the Post Office Square in 1909 at the corner of Main & Elm Streets before the site was cleared for the new Post Office.

This Waterville Post Office building, designed by Treasury Architect, James Knox Taylor, was completed in 1911. Designed after the Philadelphia Exchange (1832), it is notable for its triangular configuration due to the intersection of Elm and

Greek Revival architecture, significant in the constructed entirely with cut stone and Corinthian cylindrical lantern on the roof monument in Athens.
