

THE HENRICKSON BLOCK

Henrickson and Leslie built the original building on this site, which is document back to 1877. This building had Italianate style trim and cornice. It is the last surviving wood commercial building on Main Street. Although it has been substantial remodeled with aluminum siding, it is possible that the original ornamentation still exists behind the siding.

Henrickson Block

The building was purchased in 1915 by the Waterville Women's Association. The association maintained space on the second floor for women working downtown. There was a kitchen and a place to sit to enjoy a stress free lunch away from work. The first floor housed Farrow's Bookstore. In 1979, the building was sold to Joseph A. Roy and became home to Joseph A. Roy Real Estate. The current owner leases out the first floor as retail space.
